



SCOTTISH MINI COOPER CUP

IN ASSOCIATION WITH
PROJECT 21 DETAILING
SUPPORTED BY YOKOHAMA TYRES

This top single-make racing saloon championship has always been keenly contested. It has been a proving ground for many successful drivers, including British Touring Car Championship racers, Rory Butcher, Aiden Moffat and Chris Smiley. The cars are 1600cc Mini Coopers from 2001 -2006 with virtually standard engines, race suspensions and they all use Yokohama treaded Tyres.

There are 3 races for Minis at each meeting. The more powerful Cooper S cars which race on slick racing tyres only race twice, competing in races 1 & 2. The more standard Cooper Cup cars have three races. They also have a reversed grid in race 3. The grid positions are reversed for the top finishers from race 2 in the Cooper Cup. The exact number for the 'reversed grid' is drawn from a hat, so if 6 comes out, then the top 6 finishers are reversed on the grid. This ensures an exciting final Mini race of the day.

There is a Newcomers Cup which has always been keenly contested. Previous winners include current Cooper Cup champion Michael Weddell. Chad Little won it last year.

#### 2021: Champion Michael Weddell, 2nd Chad Little, 3rd Neil Hose.

This season all 3 race meetings and 9 races have been at Knockhill.



#### **JUNE RACES**

Race 1 – Michael Weddell got a second clear as Ian Munro held off Chad Little. Then the safety car bunched them all up. When racing resumed Weddell spent 5 laps leading a tight bunch to the flag, with Ian Munro on his bumper. Little sat close in 3rd and Daniel Paterson was 4th.

Race 2 – Chad Little led all the way, but was under pressure. Jack Irvine held 2nd from lap 2 to the flag, though Michael Weddell got alongside him on lap 6. But he finished around half a second back in 3rd with Daniel Paterson on his bumper.

Race 3 – Ryan Smith was the early leader, then Neil Hose led until lap 7 but dropped back. Ryan Smith took over and reeled off the last few laps to win. He had Daniel Paterson on his tail over the final lap. Jack Irvine was a second back in 3rd, with Gordon Long 4th. Jack Irvine won the newcomers cup class in every race.

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
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# SCOTTISH FIESTA ST **CHAMPIONSHIP**

SUPPORTED BY **REIS MOTORSPORT** INSURANCE, **YOKOHAMA TYRES &** WHEELS AROUND

There are two classes in this popular saloon car championship. Fiesta ST race cars (MK6 ST150 made 2003-2008) are powered by the standard 2 litre Duratec engine. They run on Yokohama treaded tyre, are equipped with ABS brakes and 3-way adjustable dampers. There is also a class for the slightly lesser specification Challenge cars. Fiestas have been part of SMRC meetings for decades. One graduate from earlier Fiesta XR2 Championship days, is three times BTCC champion Gordon Shedden.

#### THE SEASON SO FAR...

April Races - Race 1: Champion Steven Gray grabbed the lead early on lap 1 and was never headed. 2020 champion Dave Colville sat on his bootlid all race. Race 2: Steven Gray led from pole chased by a 6 car train. Liam McGill was 2nd just beating Mark Dickson.

May Races - Race 1: Steven Gray was never headed. Dave Colville was glued to his bumper for the entire race. Race 2: Steven Gray again led. Then Gray and Colville swapped places mid race. Gray regained the lead 2 laps later and eased away to win from Colville. Mark Dickson took 3rd late on.

June Races - Race 1: Liam McGill led all the way from pole, to take his first win of the season. He was under pressure from Steven Gray from the start. Then Gray closed right up, and they ran nose to tail over the last 2 laps. Dave Colville passed Broddy Orr with a lap to go to be 4th, then demoted lain Blackley on the last lap to take 3rd. Broddy Orr grabbed 4th late on. Race 2: On a damp track Liam McGill and Steven Gray fought for the lead. McGill led the race, then Gray took over after a couple of laps, before McGill was back leading on lap 3. McGill got clear as Gray was embroiled in a battle for 2nd with Broddy Orr. Steven Gray retook 2nd on lap 7 as Orr went off at the chicane. Into 3rd came lain Blackley. Late on Mark Dickson was through to 4th.

# SCOTTISH CLASSIC SPORTS & SALOONS CHAMPIONSHIP

A really popular Championship with both spectators and drivers. It has a good variety of cars, and the added attraction of Sportscars racing against Saloons. This is a class based championship, so overall race wins don't affect the points, drivers need to beat their own class rivals.

The classes based mainly on engine size, for cars made up to 1985. There is also a Future classics class for cars made 1st January 1985 to 31st December 1990, as well as a class for Limited production cars or specials. While MK2 Fiesta XR2s have a separate class. In 2021 saloon car drivers won every class, but in 2020 sportscar drivers took two classes, and were 1st and 2nd in the Championship.

#### **JUNE RACES**

Race 1 - John Kinmond led from pole on a damp track, in his Rover SDI saloon. He took an untroubled win. Andrew Graham held 2nd in his TR8 for a lap then Alastair Baptie went past in the MGB GT V8. They stayed close for a couple of laps then Baptie retired. Kenneth Brown in a TVR Griffith moved into 3rd and closed on Graham, these two were a few car lengths apart at the end. Elliot Paterson brought his Morgan +8 into 4th after a slow start, were he dropped to 7th. Charlie Cope got 5th in his Golf, well clear of the Lotus Eclat of Craig Houston. Michael Longstaffe won class A in his MG.

Race 2 - John Kinmond again led from the start. His big Rover saloon was over 5 seconds clear of Andrew Graham's TR8, when the safety car was sent out. A car was in the gravel trap at Clark corner mid race. It also started raining for a few minutes. When racing resumed Kinmond shot away on a wet track, and won with ease. Graham held 2nd kept a few seconds clear of Charlie Cope's Golf. Kenneth Brown was 4th in the TVR Griffith after repassing Elliot Paterson's Morgan on lap 9. Ian Mitchell took class A in 10th with the Nova. Duncan O'Neill took the XR2 class for the 2nd race running.



# SMTA SCOTTISH CITROËN C1 CUP

This one make saloon championship is an ideal starter class, and provides lots of good close racing. The Championship began in April 2019. Grids quickly grew, and everyone who raced the 1 litre C1 has enjoyed the experience. There is a **Newcomers Cup, which started last** year for drivers in their 1st or 2nd season of car racing. New this season is a reversed grid for race 2. The grid number is drawn at random, if 5 is drawn then the top 5 finishers from race I are revered on the grid, so 5th place finisher is on pole, 4th takes 2nd until the race winner starts 5th.

#### THE SEASON SO FAR...

April Races – Race 1: Champion Ross Dunn headed a 5 car train over the opening laps. Finlay Brunton moved up to 2nd on lap 6 and took the lead late on lap 11. He and Ross Dunn ran nose to tail, over the final lap. But Dunn took the win by centimetres. Nesbit was 3rd as half a second covered the top three. Race2: The top 6 finishers from race 1 were reversed on the grid. Marc Nisbet was on pole, but 3 of the top 6 spun at the first corner Duffus. This left Sam Corson leading and he stayed there to take a good win. From lap 7 the top 3 ran nose to tail with Dunn 2nd and Brunton 3rd.

May Races – Race 1: Thomas Comber led all race. He was under non-stop pressure from former champion Finlay Brunton. These two pulled clear of a 6 car train headed by Sam Corson. Race 2: was a reversed grid for the top 5. Kyle Nesbit drove past Calum Conway on lap 1 and led until lap 8. Then Sam Corson went past followed by Finlay Brunton. By lap 8 Corson was leading and he held on for the win from Finlay Brunton. Close behind was Paul Winfield who grabbed 3rd late on and won the newcomers class in both races.

June Race - Endurance Race: A 90 minute race was held on the Knockhill reverse direction track. Cars could have 1 or 2 drivers, and had to make a pit stop. All 14 starters made it to the finish. It was a close race as the top 3 were covered by 4 seconds, with 2nd and 3rd only 2 tenths of a second apart at the end. Pole sitter Kyle Nesbit driving solo led the race for 18 laps. Then Ryan Smith took over the lead. He led by 3 seconds on lap 27 with Kyle Nesbit 2nd. Sam Corson retook 3rd on lap 14, but hadn't shaken off Marc Nesbit. Ryan Smith led until lap 39 stretching his lead to 8 seconds. He pitted for Finlay Brunton to take over the car. Sam Corson then led the race with Marc Nesbit on his tail. These two swapped places on lap 41. There was a safety car period from lap 44 for 6 laps. A car was beached at the hairpin exit. Racing restarted with Marc Nesbit leading. By lap 52 Finlay Brunton had taken 2nd as Corson took over at the front, then Nesbit grabbed 2nd on lap 57. Sam Corson led until lap 57 then had a half spin at the hairpin. Brunton sailed past into the lead. The former champion was 2 seconds ahead of Corson on lap 67 when Corson retook 2nd. He closed to within a couple of car lengths of winner Brunton on lap 71 as the flag was waved. But Corson got a 30 second penalty post race and was classified 8th. Calum Conway took 2nd behind the Smith / Brunton car. Marc Nesbit was 3rd only a few tenths of a second behind and he won the newcomers class. Then Thomas Comber came in 4th.


Each competitor will be allocated a target time for the race based on average lap times relative to the class entered (using times set during both the Allcomers Qualifying session and the relevant Scottish Championship Qualifying session).

There will be two separate race results issued; an overall race result and a result determined against the target time.

Last year, on the road, John Kinmond in the big Rover SD1 V8 saloon won by less than half a second from Mike Connon in a Lotus 7 sportscar. Philip Russell was a close 3rd in his BMW saloon, as Classic cars took the top 3 places in this race. However, it was Andrew Lamont, in his MINI Cooper S, who was closest to the target time and took the overall victory.
