Whether you're attending as a driver, volunteer or spectator, or if you're joining us online from afar, we hope you enjoy an excellent days racing.



SCOTTISH MINI COOPER CUP

IN ASSOCIATION WITH
PROJECT 21 DETAILING
SUPPORTED BY YOKOHAMA TYRES

This is one of the top club single-make racing series in the UK. It has been a proving ground for many successful drivers, including British Touring Car Championship racers, Rory Butcher, Aiden Moffat and Chris Smiley. The cars are 1600cc Mini Coopers from 2001 -2006 with virtually standard engines, race suspensions and they all use Yokohama treaded Tyres.

2021: Champion Michael Weddell, 2nd Chad Little, 3rd Neil Hose, 2021 Newcomers Cup winner Chris Cockburn.

There are 3 races for Minis at each meeting. The more powerful Cooper S cars which race on slick racing tyres only race twice, competing in races 1 & 2. The more standard Cooper Cup cars have three races. They also have a reversed grid in race 3. The grid positions are reversed for the top finishers from race 2 in the Cooper Cup. The exact number for the 'reversed grid' is drawn from a hat, so if 6 comes out, then the top 6 finishers are reversed on the grid. This ensures an exciting final Mini race of the day.

There is a Newcomers Cup which has always been keenly contested. Previous winners include current Cooper Cup champion Michael Weddell. Chris Cockburn won it last year.



JUNE RACES

Race 1 – Only a second covered the top 4 at the finish as Michael Weddell beat Chad Little, Daniel Paterson and Jack Irvine.

Race 2 – This time 1.5 seconds covered the same top 4 drivers, but Chad Little won from Irvine, Weddell and Paterson

Race 3 –Ryan Smith took his first win by a tiny margin from Daniel Paterson, with Jack Irvine close in 3rd and Gordon Long less than a second back in 4th

JULY CADWELL PARK RACES

Race 1 – Michael Weddell beat Chad Little by just over half a second, as Neil Hose held off Ian Munro for 3rd.

Race 2 – This time Little won the race beating Weddell, while Hose again just took 3rd from Munro

Race 3 – Weddell won by over a second from Little, with Munro taking 3rd and Hose 4th.

This is the fastest single make saloon car class at this Scottish Championship race meeting. Full slick and wet tyre options are permitted, a 1.6 litre super charged power unit, and three way adjustable suspension. This provides drivers with an exciting saloon car. They race with the Cooper cars.

Fiestas have been part of SMRC meetings for decades. One graduate from earlier XR2 days is three times BTCC champion Gordon Shedden.

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A really popular Championship with both spectators and drivers. It has a really good variety of cars, and the added attraction of Sportscars racing against Saloons. This is a class based championship, so overall race wins don't affect the points, drivers need to beat their own class rivals.

The classes based mainly on engine size, for cars made up to 1985. There is also a Future classics class for cars made 1st January 1985 to 31st December 1990, as well as classes for MK2 Fiesta XR2s and Limited production cars or specials. In 2021 saloon car drivers won every class, but in 2020 sportscar drivers took two classes, and were 1st and 2nd in the Championship.

JULY CADWELL PARK RACES

Race 1 – Russell Paterson took a dominant win in the Morgan +8, John Kinmond's Rover was 2nd a few seconds ahead of Andrew Graham's TR8. Guest Martin Reynolds was 4th in an Escort. Alasdair Coates won class B in his Escort for the first time this year.

Race 2 – John Kinmond just beat Martin Reynolds, as Andrew Graham was a couple of seconds back in 3rd. Alistair Baptie was not far away in 4th. Russell Paterson retired early in the race. Class B went to Charlie Cope.

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
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SMTA SCOTTISH CITROËN C1 CUP

SCOTTISH LEGENDS CARS CHAMPIONSHIP

We welcome Legends Cars for the first time at an SMRC meeting this season. These cars have 1250cc or 1200cc motorcycle engines, run on control tyres and have 5/8th scale replica bodies of 1930s **American Saloons or Coupes.** Racing is always close, as the grid for race 1 is drawn at random and reversed for race 2. These two races are both over 8 laps. The final is 10 laps, and sees the highest points scoring cars from races 1 & 2 start at the back of the grid. Legends Cars also start a race differently. They have a lap behind the pace car, then it moves away. The cars must then hold their positions and not speed up until they reach the start line.

HEAT 1 – only one second covered the top 4, as Stewart Black who started 12th winning. He took the lead with 2 laps to go. Black beat Ryan McLeish by 7 tenths of a second, with mid race leader Ben Mason 3rd and Scott Bourne 4th.

HEAT 2 – 2 Ryan McLeish won beating Stewart Black and Ben Mason as the top 3 were covered by just half a second. The race was shortened to 4 laps.

FINAL – Ben Mason won, but again the top three were very close, as Ryan McLeish was 2nd and Stewart Black 3rd. Scott Bourne was 4th a few seconds back.

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
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

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


















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
