

SCOTTISH MINI COOPER CUP

IN ASSOCIATION WITH PROJECT 21 DETAILING SUPPORTED BY YOKOHAMA TYRES

This is one of the top club single-make racing series in the UK. It has been a proving ground for many successful drivers, including British Touring Car Championship racers, Rory Butcher, Aiden Moffat and Chris Smiley. The cars are 1600cc Mini Coopers from 2001 -2006 with virtually standard engines, race suspensions and they all use Yokohama treaded Tyres.

2021: Champion Michael Weddell, 2nd Chad Little, 3rd Neil Hose, 2021 Newcomers Cup winner Chris Cockburn.

There are 3 races for Minis at each meeting. The more powerful Cooper S cars which race on slick racing tyres only race twice, competing in races 1 & 2. The more standard Cooper Cup cars have three races. They also have a reversed grid in race 3. The grid positions are reversed for the top finishers from race 2 in the Cooper Cup. The exact number for the 'reversed grid' is drawn from a hat, so if 6 comes out, then the top 6 finishers are reversed on the grid. This ensures an exciting final Mini race of the day.

There is a Newcomers Cup which has always been keenly contested. Previous winners include current Cooper Cup champion Michael Weddell. Chris Cockburn won it last year.



AUGUST RACES

Race 1 – Neil Hose was over 3 seconds clear on lap 8. On this lap we had 4 cars squabbling over 2nd. lan Munro moved past Paterson to run 3rd and a lap later he was 2nd. He stayed there chasing Hose, who won the race. Chad Little got into 3rd on the last lap, leaving Gordon Long to hold off Daniel Paterson.

Race 2 - Michael Weddell started last having missed race 1, but rocketed through the field. By lap 4 was 5th in this class, having passed 11 cars. Up front Neil Hose led from Ian Munro and Chad Little. Mid race Hose went wide exiting MacIntyres and was on the dirt. He lost 3 places as Munro now led from Little and Paterson. The front three ran nose to tail, but Weddell moved up to 4th on lap 9. Weddell caught the top 3 on the final lap. The top 3 all went in tight at the final corner, defending the line. So in 4th Weddell went on a wide line at the hairpin, and slipped past Paterson to take 3rd. The winner was Chad Little

who had got past Ian Munro on Iap 7 at Clark. Weddell was 3rd but post race this became 2nd as Ian Munro received a 3 second penalty, dropping him to 5th behind Daniel Paterson and Neil Hose. In 6th Jack Irvine was also top newcomer. He'd passed 9 cars having started on the back row of the grid.

Race 3 – This race had a reversed grid for the top 7 Cooper Cup finishers in race 2. Gordon Long was on pole, but was beaten to the lead by top newcomer Jack Irvine. Ian Munro took 2nd on lap 3 leaving Long to run 3rd with Michael Weddell a close 4th. Then came Chad Little with Daniel Paterson on his bootilid. By lap 6 Irvine was well clear leading by over 4 seconds, Munro, Long and Weddell ran nose to tail disputing 2nd. They had a second gap to Hose who had Little on his bootlid, then 2 car lengths back was Ryan Smith. Jack Irvine won, followed by Ian Munro and Michael Weddell.

WHAT'S AT STAKE TODAY

It's all to play for with just 11 points separating the top 2, and one of them will become champion today. Michael Weddell has won 7 of the 15 rounds but finished 12th in round 9. Chad Little and Jack Irvine have each won 2 races. Jack Irvine has already claimed the Newcomers Cup for 2022.



This is the fastest single make saloon car class at this Scottish Championship race meeting. Full slick and wet tyre options are permitted, a 1.6 litre super charged power unit, and three way adjustable suspension. This provides drivers with an exciting saloon car. They race with the Cooper cars.

AUGUST RACES

Race 1 – The 3 cars stayed close all race, often running nose to tail. Craig Blake led from pole, then brother Jamie took over on lap 3. Andrew Lamont was right with them. They flew in close formation until lap 9 then Craig regained the lead, and went on to win. Jamie took 2nd from Andrew, at the finish just 1.6 seconds covered the top 3.

Race 2 – Craig Blake led chased by Jamie Blake, but he lost 2nd at the hairpin to Andrew Lamont. On lap 3 Lamont took the lead at Clark corner. Jamie Blake moved into 2nd on lap 5. The top 3 were running nose to tail, then Jamie took the lead on lap 7 at Clark corner. The Blake brothers swapped places a couple of times over the closing laps. Craig won from Jamie with Andrew close behind in 3rd.

WHAT'S AT STAKE TODAY

Jamie Blake has won or taken maximum points 4 of the 10 rounds but failed to finish once. Andrew Lamont has maximum points once, but has scored well in every round. The title will be decided over the two races today.

SCOTTISH FIESTA ST CHAMPIONSHIP

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There are two classes in this popular saloon car championship. Fiesta ST race cars (MK6 ST150 made 2003-2008) are powered by the standard 2 litre Duratec engine. They run on Yokohama treaded tyre, are equipped with ABS brakes and 3-way adjustable dampers. There is also a class for the slightly lesser specification Challenge cars. Fiestas have been part of SMRC meetings for decades. One graduate from earlier XR2 days is three times BTCC champion Gordon Shedden.

AUGUST RACES

Race 1 – This race was run over 7 laps after it was initially stopped by red flags. In the restart Steven Gray beat Liam McGill into the first corner and led all race. There was around 5 car lengths between them as they eased away from the field. Iain Blackley held 3rd all race despite Andrew Mackie staying close in 4th.

Race 2 – Liam McGill beat Steven Gray into Duffus and took the race lead. He kept it all the way to the chequered flag. Gray closed the gap over the final 2 laps to under a second but got no closer. There was an early battle over 3rd. Gerald Henry took 3rd on lap 4 and slowly got clear. This left lain Blackley in 4th to fend off Kieren Preedy for the rest of the race, as they finished only a couple of tenths apart.

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WHAT'S AT STAKE TODAY

Steven Gray and Liam McGill have both won 5 races of the 10 held so far. Gray's non finish in round 8 has seen the two title contenders draw level on points. This is the closest of all championship races, can Gray successfully defend his title? He has not finished lower than 2nd all season.

AUGUST RACES

Race 1 – David Brown led all the way from lights to the chequered flag in the TVR Griffith. Andrew Graham chased him in the TR8, but the TVR was 3 seconds clear by lap 2. Brown finished just over 14 seconds ahead at the end. The TR8 got away from guest Martin Reynolds in his Escort MK2. There was a battle over 4th. Mario Ferrari was back with a Ferrari 308GTB, he got up to 4th then retired on lap 5. This left Charlie Cope 4th about 3 seconds ahead of Alasdair Coates MGB GT V8. But on the last lap they swapped places. Charlie Cope was 5th winning his class.

Race 2 – The TVR of Kenneth Brown again led all the way, and he won as he pleased. Andrew Graham was 2nd all race in the TR8 and eased away from Martin Reynolds Escort MK2. Into 4th came Charlie Cope, his VW Golf was a few car lengths ahead of Alasdair Coates MGB GT until lap 10 when the MG got past. Charlie finished 5th but importantly won his class again. In 6th was Craig Houston with his Lotus Excel less than 2 seconds back. Two drivers had double class wins, Duncan O'Neil in the XR2 class and Ian Mitchell class A again with his Nova. John Kinmond had mechanical problems with his Rover SD1 and did not start either race.

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
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SMTA SCOTTISH CITROËN C1 CUP

Finlay Brunton went from 6th to 3rd by lap 2 and then got 2nd at MacInytres on lap 5. The race was stopped a lap later when a car rolled at Butchers. Post race Brunton was excluded on a technical issue. Davidson won from Max Watt, then newcomers Paul Winfield and James Hitchen. Only half a second covered the drivers in 2nd to 4th.

SCOTTISH LEGENDS CARS CHAMPIONSHIP

We welcome Legends Cars to the final SMRC meeting of this season. These cars have 1250cc or 1200cc motorcycle engines, run on control tyres and have 5/8th scale replica bodies of 1930s American Saloons or Coupes. Racing is always close, as the grid for race 1 is drawn at random and reversed for race 2. These two races are both over 8 laps. The final is 10 laps, and sees the highest points scoring cars from races 1 & 2 start at the back of the grid. Legends Cars also start a race differently. They have a lap behind the pace car, then it moves away. The cars must then hold their positions and not speed up until they reach the start line. They come round to the start two by two on the road, and take a rolling or moving start. Then as they pass the start / finish line, the race starts.

Points scoring, each race the winner scores 200, then 2nd 185, 3rd 170, 4th 160, 5th 150 etc down to 20, with all other starters score 10 points and drivers who retire get 5 points. With three races each round, there are a maximum of 600 points available.

SEPTEMBER RACES KMSC KNOCKHILL

Race 1 – Ben Mason was on pole but Stewart Black took the lead and stayed there until lap 6, when Mason took the lead and went on to win. Black was 2nd with Ryan McLeish coming through the field, going from last to finish 3rd a place he grabbed on lap 3. Pino Palazzo took 4th moving up from 7th.

Race 2 – Ryan McLeish led all the way to win as he pleased. Stewart Black went from 10th to 2nd in two laps and stayed there. Ben McNeice was 3rd as Ben Mason made a late move to get 4th passing Pino Palazzo.

Race 3 – (Final) The race had to be rerun and was shortened to 5 laps, it had been stopped. Stewart Black led on lap 1 and won the race 1.3 seconds ahead of Ryan McLeish, who moved into 2nd on lap 2 and stayed there. Ben Mason got into 3rd on lap 1 passing a few cars. He finished there a second back on McNeice in 3rd. Ben McNeice was 4th, having moved up from 8th.

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
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
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
